Our Purpose: Providing refuge, restoration and redirection for marginalized girls of Kenya

Our Mission: Upholding a loving Christian environment, providing quality education, developing self-sustainability and positively impacting our community

Refuge - from a life of extreme poverty, abuse or danger, to loving, holistic care. Most girls are referred to LOH by the county child services as identified with a serious need

10 girls rescued to safety and hope in 2022



Restoration - Education, Counseling, Club Activities, Personal Development

Light of Hope served 172 girls in 2022
These are boarders (61), day scholars (69),
high schoolers (32) and college/university (10)

Redirection - Hope for a fulfilled life and future

10 girls are enrolled in post-high school education

3 launched back to community as responsible, educated, contributing members of their communities

Our medical clinic and professional nurse will oversee girls' health and health education and reach out to our local community in service and care



Quality education - Each girl who reaches advanced education inspires those around her.
Academic performance shows good scores in national exams

Girls receive counseling, contact with home village and distant family is encouraged. Fun!! Clubs: girl scouts, creative hands, sewing, knitting, crafts, performance/dance club- going to regional dance competition,

How you have impacted Light of Hope!!

Rescued: 10 girls from poverty to hope for a bright future

Admitted: 69 Day scholars to pre-primary grades giving an opportunity for adequate nutrition and education (14 new this year)

Clinic: We screened 225 patients, detecting some serious health concerns and referred to local care. A full-time professional nurse is now at Light of Hope “Shot Peak” Medical Clinic

High school graduates: 3 applying for funds to pursue higher education

College or university: 10 girls

8th grade graduates: 15 in High schools determined by national exam scores

Staff: 23 Grounds keepers, security, cooks, administrator, social worker, dorm mothers

Devoted teachers: 11

Farm: 10 cows, 125 chickens, about 4,054 eggs produced and 8,089 liters of milk.
Produce - bushels of potatoes, kale, onions, bananas from the school garden

Computer lab: 36 computers/tablets with internet available to advance learning. Plus 1 plane simulator

Our History:

Light Of Hope was founded by Boni and Sandy Karanja, each with a heart committed to following God's call to serve girls experiencing abuse, abandonment or extreme poverty in Kenya. They opened LOH in 2005 with 6 girls, 2 buildings and 2 staff

Sustainability goals - initiatives to work toward self-sustainability within the Kenyan economy

Produce - small business selling

Vocational school - for our girls and potential of offering to public-tailoring, welding computer skills

Medical clinic charging small, locally acceptable fee to provide accessible care

Farm - cows (which the girl's milk) eggs, goats and sheep

Organic garden with kale, bananas, onions, tomatoes

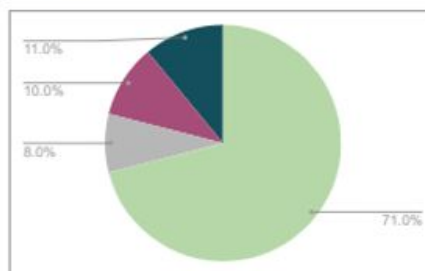

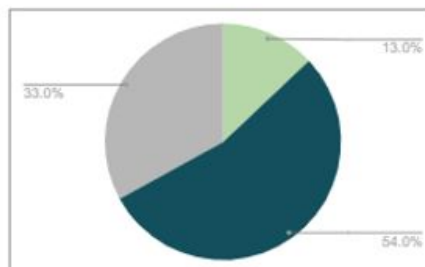
